## SOCCER

The Monroe Township High School Unified Soccer team has been asked by the Special Olympics New Jersey as the only high school to represent NJ as members of the 2019 Red Bulls Unified team (called RBNY Unified)
The New York Red Bulls Unified team is part of a national Major League Soccer initiative called the Unified Exchange Program, in which MLS clubs sign a Special Olympics Unified team from their corresponding state to train and compete in two matches against other MLS Unified teams. Competition days include tickets for the Unified team to watch the First Team matches before or after the Unified game. Every MLS team participates in this initiative that has been running for seven years.
12 players (with/without intellectual disabilities) from our MTHS Unified Soccer team will combine with the professional players from the NY Red Bulls to form the RBNY Unified team. MTHS unified team attended the Red Bulls signing day. MTHS players signed an official team contract and become RBNY Unified. They represent Special Olympics New Jersey (SONJ) and the Unified movement as a leader for inclusion awareness and acceptance.
The team went to Kansas City on April 13-15 on a sponsored trip by the NY Red Bulls to Kansas City, Missouri. On April 13th they attended a Kansas City Royals game with the Kansas City sporting unified soccer team. On April 14th they competed in a match against the Kansas City Unified team.
On May 3rd - LA Unified and NY Red Bulls unified teams went to One World Trade to take a tour and eat together, and on May 4th they played a match against the LA Galaxy unified team. Congratulations to the team and their coaches on this awesome opportunity.
