ROBOTICS CLUB







On October 5th, 2023, MTHS Robotics hosted the first ever Girl Powered workshop during the Women's Leadership Conference hosted by the MTHS Entrepreneurship Club. Girl Powered is an internationally recognized workshop promoting girls in Robotics and STEM. It is an initiative by the REC foundation (incorporating VEX Robotics) with the aim to redefine the face of STEM and to reflect the diversity of the millions pursuing STEM. Led by Mrs. Vanitha Gaurishankar (advisor of MTHS Robotics & PLTW teacher) and her student leaders, the event was extremely successful.



The first half of the session consisted of speeches from notable women engineers in STEM - Aimee Hurst (NJDOT), Cristy Richards and Victoria Kaiser (JAKTOOL). They spoke about their careers, challenges they faced in STEM, and how it helped them become greater leaders in their fields.

Student leader Manvi Sinha then led a hands-on robotics workshop for students from the high school & Monroe and Jamesburg middle schools. They were able to build, and code VEX Go-Bots together in groups. At the end, the goal was to create a Women in STEM parade with images of notable females all across the globe such as Laika- the first dog to fly into outer space, Kalpana Chawla, and Rosalind Franklin to name a few.

Over 30 students attended this event with positive response. Overall, the event was a huge success as a tribute to women in STEM, as well as an addition to the many achievements of the MTHS Robotics Club.
