Honor Society Requirements

Science National Honor Society Requirements

Membership is open to students in 11th or 12th grade who have taken a science honors or AP course to 10th grade students as provisional members.

The criteria are as follows:

- · Must maintain an overall minimum unweighted GPA of 3.0
- · Must maintain a minimum unweighted Science GPA of 3.5
- · Must currently be enrolled in an Honors or AP Science Class in application year
 - Seniors and Juniors must have at least TWO Honors or AP level science classes taken before or during their respective years
 - Sophomores must have completed one Honors or AP level science class
- · Must completed the required attendance and volunteer hours (5 pts./semester) to be in good standing For additional information, please consult: https://www.sciencenhs.org/

Requirements for the Société Honoraire de Français

Invitation to membership shall be restricted to those students actively engaged in the study of French in a secondary school when appropriate courses are available or when outside courses become part of the student's secondary transcript, credits, and grade point.

- Candidates must be enrolled in the fourth semester of French or higher, i.e., the second semester of Level II or the equivalent
- Candidates must be in the 10th, 11th, or 12th grade of high school. Exception is made for 9th
 grade students who meet requirement "1" above because of work at the middle school or junior
 high level
- Transfer students must have spent at least one full semester in the high school before becoming eligible for invitation to membership.

Scholastic Eligibility Requirements to be met by all students:

- Candidates must have maintained an A- (90) average or higher in French throughout their secondary school study of French, including the semester of selection and all previous work awarded secondary school credit.
- Candidates must have maintained a B- (80) average or higher in all other secondary school subjects prior to the semester of selection.

National Art Honor Society

Students must have taken an Art related course and achieve a 90 or higher. (Studio, Ceramics & Sculpture, Graphic Design, Photography, Digital Photography)

- All students must maintain a 3.0 average Grade Point Average (GPA).
- Students must have a letter of recommendation filled out by a teacher.
- After being accepted, NAHS members must accumulate 25 hours annually to be eligible for induction. Seniors will also receive a graduation cord.
- Students must present a small portfolio of 3-5 original works of art. Any art mediums, including digital art are acceptable, and should show variation of mediums used.

Tri-M Music Honor Society - Monroe Township High School

General Standards for Admission

All students who would like to be considered for admission into Tri-M must possess all attributes listed below:

Participation:

- Students must be in 10th, 11th, or 12th grade in for the following school year (applying in April)
- Will be enrolled in a performance-based honors weighted music class for following school year
- Enrolled in a performance-based music class during the current school year

Scholarship:

- Students must maintain Honor Roll status
- Students must have an A average in all music classes

Leadership:

- Student demonstrates musical leadership within the school or community.
- Examples include, but are not limited to: section leader of a school/community ensemble, teaching private lessons, etc.

Solo Musical Proficiency:

- Student demonstrates the ability to successfully perform a solo or excerpt from a curricular ensemble's repertoire during their Tri-M audition.
- Student will perform a cappella. Students should showcase proficiency in regard to potential performance at an upcoming Tri-M induction.

MTHS Chapter of the Rho Kappa National Social Studies Honor Society

This honor society is for SENIORS ONLY. Students will apply in the spring of their junior year and be inducted in the spring of their senior year. Students who have a 90% or better in Honors History, or an 85% or better in Advanced Placement History (unweighted) and a minimum of TWO Years of Honors or AP History in required history courses will receive an invitation to apply to the honor society in the spring of their junior year.

Additional requirements include:

- 1. Must be enrolled in or have previously taken a Social Studies elective course and have an average of 85% or better (unweighted)
 - Qualifying Electives:
 - AP Psychology
 - Psychology
 - Sociology
 - American Image on Film/Civic Action
 - AP Human Geography
 - Holocaust and Genocide
 - Intro to Law/Con Law
 - African American Experience
 - AP European History
 - AP Government
- 2. Student applicants will be reviewed by the Social Studies staff. Violations of the school Academic Integrity Agreement, including but not limited to plagiarism and cheating, disqualifies your eligibility.
- 3. Student applicants will be reviewed for conduct violations by their vice principal.

- 4. Ten hours of community service in the past year.
 - The following constitutes some ideas for community service: volunteering at the library, Falcon PALS, coaching a youth sport, UNICEF, Meals-on-Wheels, animal shelters, etc.
 - The following are some ideas of what does NOT constitute community service: helping at your parents' workplace, babysitting, going food shopping with your grandparents, mowing the lawn at home/grandparent's house, or anything of a similar nature.
- 5. A typed, MLA formatted essay of no more than 2 pages in response to this prompt: Why is it important to learn history?

National Honor Society

Juniors and Seniors may apply if they meet the criteria listed below after completion of the 2nd Marking Period. Eligible students will be notified directly from the advisors near the end of February. Criteria

- A cumulative weighted GPA of at least 90.000 (not rounded)
- · 30 hours of community service accumulated during high school
- · 10 hours of leadership accumulated during high school
- A 2-4 page essay using MLA format explaining why you should be an active member in the National Honor Society.
- · 2 teacher recommendations

National English Honor Society

Eligibility and Maintaining Membership

- · Honors and AP juniors and seniors
- · 90 or better in Honors, 85 or better in AP
- 20 hours of community service per year in literacy-building activities (*10 hours during pandemic year)
- · Active attendance at all meetings
- · Active participation in NEHS-sponsored events and fundraisers
- · Leadership, service, and character

Spanish Honor Society Requirements:

Students must fulfill ALL these requirements to be inducted

- Be a current student in a Spanish class (at least Spanish III).
- Demonstrate continued completion of grade criteria: at least a 95% average each MP and for the year in Spanish II, a 90% average each MP and for the year in Spanish 2H, 3, 4, or Contemporary Issues or an 85% average each MP and for the year in Spanish 3H, 4H, or AP.
- Have a clean discipline record (no more than 1 detention).
- Attend at all Honor Society meetings (we average one per month; have no more than 2 absences throughout the year).
- Fully participate in all our fundraising and community service activities.
- Earn the required number of membership points as determined by the student board for participating in SHS cultural activities.
- Have no record of cheating, plagiarism, or any other form of academic dishonesty, as per your Spanish teacher.

Italian Honor Society Requirements:

Criteria:

- Students must be in your second year of Italian.
- Students must have a good discipline record. (No more than one detention)
- Students must have maintained at least a 87% average each semester last year in Italian 2, 2 honors or 3 or at least an 85% average each semester last year in Italian 3 or 3 honors, or 4 honors

Mu Alpha Theta Math Honors Society

Anyone can participate, but in order to be inducted:

- Students must have completed Geometry
- 90 or above in CP Math classes 85 or above average in Honors/AP Math Classes
- 80% attendance at all meetings (excluding exec board meetings)
- Participation in at least 3 mathematics competitions
- Complete 5 hours of tutoring (this year we substituted 3 hours virtual via online instructional videos)
