All four elements are required in order for a HIB determination to be made

Element 1 Element 2 Can the act be reasonably perceived as being Does the act substantially disrupt or interfere motivated by either an actual or perceived with the orderly operation of the school or the characteristic such as race, color, religion, rights of other pupils? ancestry, national origin, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, and expressive or mental, physical or sensory disability or any other distinguishing characteristic? Element 3 Element 4 Is the act: Is there an imbalance of power? Physically or emotionally harming? Damaging property? Instilling fear? Insulting or demeaning to a pupil or a group? Creating a hostile educational environment by interfering with the pupil's education?

-Please note that by law, all reports of Harassment, Intimidation, and Bullying must be investigated following a mandated set of protocol. If you have concern, but are not sure whether a situation is potentially HIB related: please report your concerns to the building principal or school counselor as soon as possible. Please be cautious not to label but rather report behavior.

What Bullying Is NOT	Characteristics of Bullying
Arguments/Conflict Not liking someone	An imbalance of power Manipulation of a situation
Exclusion Teasing	Targets others based on differences Feeling superior
Being bossy	Insensitive to the feelings/need of others
Rivalry	Intolerance of differences
Expressing unpleasant thoughts or feelings regarding others	Control or dominance over others
