#### VIDEO PRODUCTION

MTHS Video Production students, once again, won an award for their work in the New Jersey High School Film Challenge. On May 25<sup>th,</sup> three teams of Monroe's Video Production students, along with teachers, Boris Hladek and Larissa Miller, attended the Film Challenge workshops and awards ceremony at Jackson Liberty High School. The entry produced by **Jessica Antonacci**, **Joseph Vitale**, and **Tristan Vidal** won the "Best Performance" award.

In April, student teams from around the state had five days to write, film, edit, and submit a project based on a prompt and following specific guidelines. The top 20 entries were screened at the May 25<sup>th</sup> event, followed by the awards ceremony. While MTHS entries have won "Best Overall," "Best Comedy," and "Audience Choice" (two times) since 2013, this is the first year that our students have won this particular award.
