ECONOMICS & FINANCE TEAM

The MTHS Economics & Finance Team earned a tie for 2nd place at the Middlesex County Consumer Bowl. Team members (left to right) Rhea Bandaru (captain), Jasmine Yang, Akash Reddy, and Shivan Suratia gave an impressive showing by Monroe Township High School in their 2nd appearance at the event sponsored by the NJ Division of Consumer Affairs. The event was held at South Amboy High School on Wednesday, January 30th. Monroe Township High School is poised to host this event in 2020. The event is held annually at the county, regional, and state level as a community outreach

program to educate students to be responsible and knowledgeable consumers.



SCIENCE LEAGUE

The participation in the First Test of the 2019 season of the New Jersey Science League (a.k.a. Science-letes) was the highest ever, with **144** tests completed by our students at MTHS.

The Science League is unique in both the State and our Nation. In existence since 1962, the League now offers competitions in Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Environmental Science and Earth-Science/Astronomy. The purpose of the Science League is to provide competitions between schools in selected science areas of study throughout the state of New Jersey. All competitions are on two levels.

One level is for the students directly. Students within any one testing area are ranked with each other, across New Jersey, based upon their scores on 3 of the 4 exams (held once a month, during the first four months of each calendar year). Any student completing 3 of the 4 exams receives a certificate from the Science League. The top ten percent (10%) of the students receiving a certificate also receive a student plaque. The second level of competition is between the teams, which represent the schools. Team scores are equal to the sum of the top 2 student scores and are cumulative from January through April. The cumulative team score for each year is used to rank all the participant schools in New Jersey. The top 10 schools (not 10%) are awarded plaques. Exceptions are those subject areas having less than 100 schools participating. Those subject areas are awarded plaques for the top 10% of the schools in the subject area.

Last year our Chemistry students earned top-10 status and a plaque for our school.

ART

The inspirational artwork created by some of the most dedicated teen artists from across the state of New Jersey was on view at Monroe Township Library from January 4th — January 31st. The artwork on display was part of the 2018-19 State Teen Arts Touring Visual Art Exhibition curated by the New Jersey State Teen Arts Festival.

The 2018-19 State Teen Arts Touring Visual Art Exhibit features the nominated paintings, drawings and photographs created by the most dedicated art students across the state. The students' Home Counties nominated 20 pieces of student art work to be showcased for display at the 2018 New Jersey State Teen Arts Festival this past May and June. Four student art works were nominated by each county to be part of the State Teen Arts Touring Visual Art Exhibit. The 55 art pieces featured in the New Jersey State Teen Arts Touring Visual Art Exhibit were selected from among thousands of pieces of artwork showcased from 17 different counties: Atlantic, Burlington, Cape May, Cumberland, Essex, Gloucester, Hudson, Mercer, Middlesex, Monmouth, Morris, Ocean, Passaic, Salem, Somerset, Sussex, and Union.

Four Monroe Township High School students were selected by virtual adjudication to be representatives of Middlesex County for the New Jersey State Teen Arts Festival's 2018-19 State Teen Arts Touring Visual Art Exhibit, they are as follows:

All schools must complete and submit a school registration prior to attending the State Festival.




