Congratulations to Aarav Modi on winning the Boys Tennis GMC tournament. He was the overall Champion and is the first Falcon in school history to accomplish that feat!







Summer Safety Tips For Pets



Happy and Healthy Pets

Summer is approaching fast and as we prepare for a hot and fun season, it's very important to keep in mind these simple tips and tricks for keeping your pets happy and healthy during the summer.

Check them out below!

- Take your pet to the vet for their regular spring/summer checkup.
- Give your pets clean, fresh water! Pets can get dehydrated very quickly, so it's important to remember to keep them hydrated when it is hot or humid outdoors.
- Give your pets a nice, shady area to get out of the sun.
- Be careful not to over-exercise pets and keep them inside when the temperatures are extreme.
- Know the symptoms of overheating: some include excessive panting, difficulty breathing, increased heart/ respiratory rate, drooling, mild weakness, and collapse (just to name a few).



- Animals with flat faces (for example Pugs and Persian Cats), are more susceptible to heat stroke since they can't pant as effectively, try to keep them as cool as possible.
- **NEVER** leave you animals alone in a parked vehicle!
- Don't leave pets unsupervised around pools and other bodies of water. Not all dogs are great swimmers and some don't even know how to. Gradually introducing your pet to water is a great way to get them swimming, but don't forget to make sure they wear a flotation device, especially in the ocean.

Paws For Cause cont'd

 Rinse pets off after swimming in a pool, so you can get rid of the chlorine and other chemicals from their coat.

It's Hot Out!

- Don't shave your dog, the long layers of your dog's coat is what protects them from overheating and sunburn.
- If the temperature is high, don't let your pets linger too long on hot asphalt.

 Being closer to the ground will cause your pet to heat up quicker and standing for long periods of time can burn the paw pads on dogs.
- Food and drinks found at barbecues can be poisonous or very dangerous to pets, so please be mindful of what foods they eat.
- Don't use fireworks around pets. Exposure to lit fireworks can be very harmful and cause severe burns or trauma. Also, many dogs are scared of fireworks, so try your best to keep them away from these loud noises.

Most importantly... Don't forget to HAVE FUN with your pets, family, and friends this summer!
