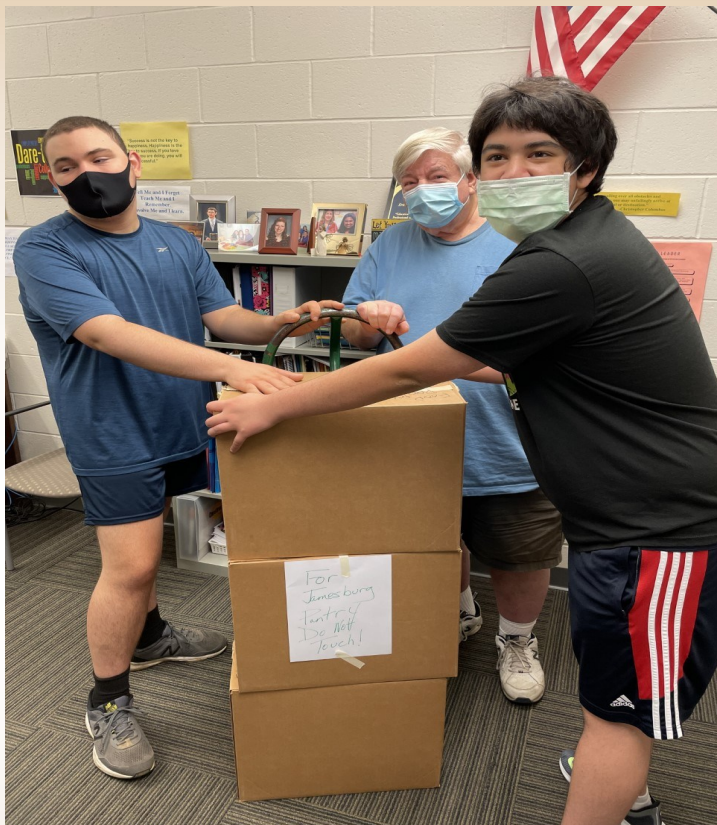
ACADEMIC TEAM
